





Internal Medicine at Palm



Beach Equine Clinic Equine internal medicine by definition is focused on treating diseases of the internal systems of the horse, but for Board Certified Large Animal Internist

Dr. Peter Heidmann, DVM, MPH, it boils down to an analytical way of thinking and approaching any equine health concerns.




