The property, located eight miles from Saratoga Springs, features eight new riding arenas engineered with state-of-the-art drainage systems and highperformance, all-weather footing. The venue provides an expansive area for competition, practice rings, stabling, turnout paddocks, vendors and public viewing. The horse farm was a gift to Skidmore College from the estate of the late **Robert R. Rosenheim** of Sharon, Connecticut.

As the Longines FEI World Cup Jumping Toronto becomes the featured event with increased prize money of \$205,000 on Saturday night, November 10, the crowd-favorite **\$85,000 GroupBy Big Ben Challenge** now highlights Thursday evening, November 8. This year's Royal Horse Show will feature six Longines World Rider Ranking classes in total. The **\$100,000 Canadian Show Jumping Championship** returns on opening weekend with the nation's top riders going head to head over two days on November 2 and 3, with the winner being crowned the Canadian Show Jumping Champion. Eventing is highlighted by the **\$20,000 Horseware Indoor Eventing Challenge** while the **\$25,000 Knightwood Hunter Derby** and an innovative new Dressage Derby will come together to form "Double Derby Night" on Tuesday, November 6.

For jumper competitors, highlights include the \$10,000 Open Welcome, held each Thursday, and the \$30,000 Grand Prix, held the first five Saturdays of the six-week circuit, before concluding with a \$50,000 Grand Prix on the final weekend.
