The Adequan®/FEI North American Youth Championships, presented by Gotham North, had a successful debut at Old Salem Farm in North Salem, New York, on August 1–5. Dressage and show jumping competitors from the United States, Canada, Guatemala, Mexico and Puerto Rico participated at the children's, junior and young rider levels. Old Salem Farm held the NAYC as a stand-alone event to highlight the prestige of the competition and recognize its position as a pivotal stepping stone in the development of young riders for international and Olympic level sport. Additionally, Old Salem Farm partnered with event sponsor Gotham North to provide prize money at NAYC for the first time. Old Salem Farm has been selected to host the 2019 NAYC as well.
