Leslie Howard concluded two weeks of showing at Old Salem Farm Spring Horse Shows in North Salem, New York, with a win on Sunday, May 19, in the \$133,700 Empire State Grand Prix CSI₃*, presented by The Kincade Group, riding Quadam. Leslie first won a grand prix on the field at Old Salem Farm in 1983 riding Albany. "It's like home for me, and this is a very knowledgeable crowd here because this is horse country," Leslie said. Beezie Madden rode Garant to top the \$50,000 Old Salem Farm Grand Prix CSI2*, presented by The Kincade Group, while Canada's Mario Deslauriers riding Amsterdam 27 won the \$35,700 New York Welcome Stake CSI2* on May 10. Gotham Enterprizes-owned horses had a successful two weeks at the Old Salem Farm Spring Horse Shows held May 8–19, with the highlight being Georgina Bloomberg's win in the \$35,700 Welcome Stake of North Salem CSI3* on May 16 riding Quibelle. "Old Salem is where I grew up riding and it's where most of my childhood memories are from," said Georgina. "I rode here for over 15 years, so to be able to come back and compete here has so much meaning for me." Georgina and Quibelle also placed fourth in the \$10,000 Old Salem Farm Speed Stake on May 15. Georgina's 8-yearold homebred, Manhattan, jumped four clean rounds in the 1.40-1.45m division at Old Salem Farm, placing in the top five each time. Another homebred, South Street, won a 1.35m class during week one of Old Salem. In addition, **Jeremy Sweetnam** rode Gotham Enterprizes' Cliff Z to second place in the \$10,000 U25 Grand Prix during week two and won a 1.30m class with Gotham Enterprizes' Calista.
