







# **David Arcand Jumps to Grand Prix Victory in Nation's Capital**

Ottawa, Ontario - David Arcand of Boisbriand, QC, led the victory gallop after winning the \$25,000 Grand Prix held on Saturday, May 25, at Wesley Clover Parks

in Ottawa, ON.
The Montreal-based professional brought out his top horse, Phil v/d Wezelse Heihoeve, for the second week of competition in the Ottawa Welcome tourna-ment. The pair were one of six horse-rider combina-

tions to jump fault-free over the first-round course set by Shane Wooley and advance to the jump-off.

Competing in Wesley Clover Parks' All-Weather Ring, the six jump-off con-tenders returned hoping to take home the win, along with the winner's share of the prize money. As the fourth jump-off challenger, Arcand laid down another clear round in a time of 36.71 seconds to move to the top of the leaderboard. When the final two riders failed to improve on his performance, the victory went to Arcand. Stephanie Bourassa of Laval, QC, who had finished third in last week's \$15,000 Julia MacAngus Memorial Grand

At the time, Theriault was at a crossroads in her life. On the surface things appeared as they should.

She had forged a blossoming career in the insurance industry as a successful account executive. Her personal life appeared stable and happy; nothing seemed out of the

But inside, Theriault was fighting the demons of childhood sexual abuse and the paralyzing anxiety associated with unresolved trauma.

Anne thought that she had dealt with years of childhood victimization. She had ventured out on her own from Sudbury, established a promising career and settled in with a kind, supportive and understanding life partner. Like most of us, she was coping and making her way through
